### **EADA Business School maintains its position in the TOP 30 for financial training**

- ***93% of participants find work 3 months after completing the programme***
- ***88% are international students***

**Barcelona, 21st June 2021.** According to the **Master in Finance Ranking 2021**, published by the prestigious Financial Times, the International Master in Finance at EADA Business School has consolidated its position as one of the top 30 in the world for postgraduate training in finance, at number 28. The yearlong programme, which is aimed at recent graduates wishing to pursue a career in the finance sector, offers a high rate of employability with 93% of graduates finding work 3 months after they finish the programme. Director of the programme, Jaume Bonet, points to the 88% of international participation with students from over 35 countries as **“a factor that sets our programme apart in Spain”**.

The results of this ranking are framed within the context of the changes that EADA Business School has introduced to its finance programmes with digital transformation and sustainability at their core.

The *Financial Times* ranking is compiled based on various qualitative and quantitative parameters such as salary received 3 years after training, labour market insertion 3 months after completing the programme, the percentage of international participants, female presence or the number of PhD holders in the faculty, among other aspects. The student satisfaction score, which was added to the ranking last year, is rated at 8.93/10.

**EADA Business School Barcelona** was founded in 1957 by a group of entrepreneurs and professionals as an ideologically and economically independent institution. As well as appearing in the recognised international rankings of the Financial Times and The Economist, it holds the EQUIS accreditation from the EFMD (European Foundation for Management Development) and the AMBA which recognises the quality of its MBA programmes.
